


- #1 Largemouth bass and an occasional musky will roam the deep weedline in summer and fall. Try a Carolina Rig for largemouth and crankbaits for musky.
- #2 Walleye roam the shallows adjacent to the island after dark in summer. Cast shallow running crankbaits.
- #3 The lower inlet is good for spring bluegill and largemouth bass.
- #4 The outlet attracts all species in May and June use spinnerbaits for bass and pike.
- #5 Fish atop the shallow weed point in May and early June, but concentrate on the weedline in mid summer and fall.
- #6 Walleye hold in this deep hole in summer and fall. Drift with leeches and crawlers in summer but switch to a jig and minnow in fall.
